
One day Mrs. Browne visited her daughter Belinda's second-grade classroom for story time.

Ben said, "At first you do not understand it, but once you receive Him it makes sense. It's like imagining a place you have never been to, and then you go there and know what it is like."




Josh responded, "I felt very loved."



"Those are wonderful answers," said Mrs. Browne. "You felt loved and happy because Jesus loves you very much."




"Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven." Matthew 19:14

Is the treasure buried in the sand? Would a map lead them to it?


Emily wondered if her dog could help her find it.




Is the treasure in Mom's purse? Or is it kept in a box underneath someone's bed? Perhaps it is buried in the ground next to a castle.




Mrs. Browne took a deep breath and smiled at the children.

Paten

A plate, usually made of gold or silver, that is used to hold the Host during the celebration of the Eucharist.

Pyx

A container used to carry the Eucharist to the sick.

Tabernacle

The dwelling place of God in church.

The Eucharist is reserved there to bring as Communion to the sick and dying, and for private visits to adore our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

Collect the signatures of others who know where our Treasure can be found.				

Go through the book and see if you can find the following items:

Crosses, fish, Bibles, chalices, angels, Hosts, a priest, a dove, crowns, hearts, Monstrances.



Point to earthly treasure and to the Eucharist, our true Treasure.
